BYELAW

FOR GOOD RULE AND GOVERNMENT MADE BY THE NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL IN PURSUANCE OF THE POWERS CONTAINED IN SECTION 249 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1933



EXTENT OF BYELAW

This Byelaw shall have effect and be in force in the whole of the Administrative County of Nottingham except in the boroughs of East Retford, Mansfield, Newark and Worksop.

UPROOTING OF FERNS, PRIMROSES AND OTHER PLANTS

1. No person shall without lawful authority uproot any ferns, primroses or other plants growing in any road, lane, roadside waste, roadside bank or hedge, common or other place to which the public have access.

PENALTY

2. Every person who shall offend against this Byelaw shall be liable on summary conviction for every such offence to a fine not exceeding Twenty Pounds.

3. The Byelaw made by the County Council on the 31st July 1934 and confirmed by the Secretary of State on 14th November 1934 in relation to the uprooting of ferns and other plants is hereby repealed.
